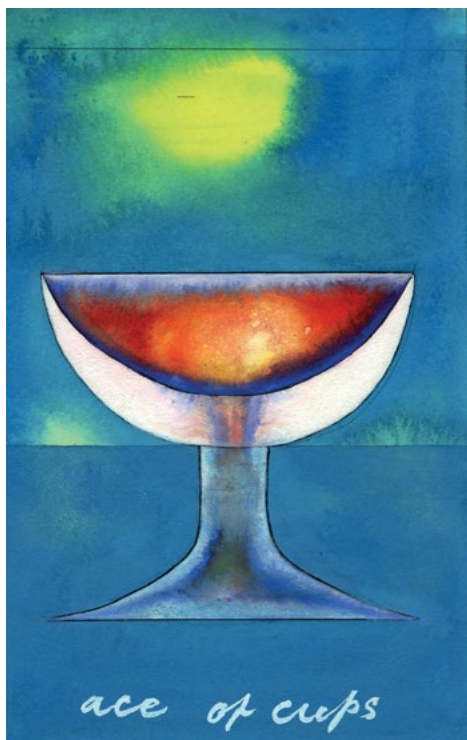

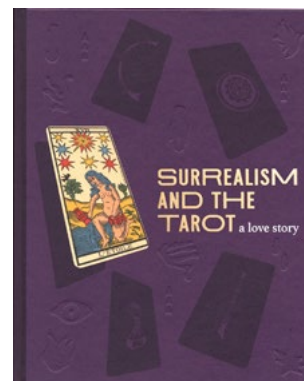


Surrealism and the Tarot: A Love Story

A definitive volume illuminating the under-studied role of tarot design in the Surrealist movement

Many long-held aficionados of Surrealism will have heard of the tarot created by Salvador Dalí, or of *Arcane 17*, André Breton's novel dedicated to Major Arcana card XVII, The Star. Those with more recent interest might have also encountered the wonderful deck designed by Leonora Carrington, discovered in Mexico in 2018. But was there really a place for tarot in Surrealism? Did the Surrealists prophesize with tarot cards, or just play with them? Did they use existing cards, and if so, which ones? Did they make their own? This groundbreaking publication from Fulgur Press, a leading voice on esotericism and magic in visual culture, answers these questions and many more. Through a series of essays from renowned experts in the field, including Susan Aberth and Tere Arcq, the book addresses a topic that has received very little in-depth scholarly study so far. Extensively illustrated, *Surrealism and the Tarot: A Love Story* highlights surrealist tarot designs, examines the incorporation of tarot cards and designs in surrealist film, art, literature and polemics, and explores the influence of surrealist visual tropes on contemporary tarot design. Spanning the 1920s to the present day, the book explores the full breadth of international surrealist interest in cartomancy. *Surrealism and the Tarot: A Love Story* highlights work from a wide-ranging slew of Surrealists, from Penny Slinger to Ithell Colquhoun, from Victor Brauner to Jorge Camacho, and from Kay Sage to Alejandro Jodorowsky, among many others.

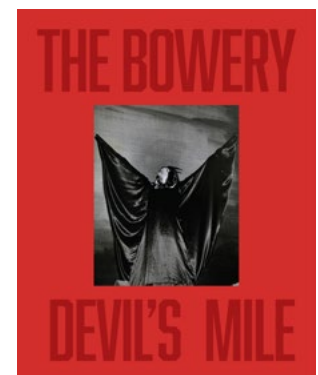
Once known as the world's most notorious skid row, the Bowery has, over five centuries, had many incarnations: a Lenape footpath; a home to farms and cattle drives; the site of racetracks and pleasure gardens; and a center of popular entertainment with theaters, concert halls, tattoo parlors and dime museums. Known for its extremes and for its vibrant, risqué rowdiness, muscularity and grit, the Bowery—the street that the New Museum calls home—was once known as “Devil's Mile.”

In more recent years, the Bowery has been the spine of a thriving artists' community, which ushered in yet another new era for the iconic street. Here, the lingering grit of the old Bowery clashes with the wealth of the now long-gentrified area straddling Manhattan's Lower East Side and East Village.

Accompanying the eponymous exhibition at the New Museum, *The Bowery: Devil's Mile* underscores the Bowery as a site of ongoing experimentation and perpetual reinvention: the haunt of gangs, performers, entrepreneurs and artists, and a host of prominent characters from Peter Stuyvesant, P.T. Barnum and Jacob Riis to William Burroughs, Eva Hesse and Keith Haring. This remarkable book gathers artworks and artifacts that explore the Bowery as a street, a neighborhood and a state of mind.

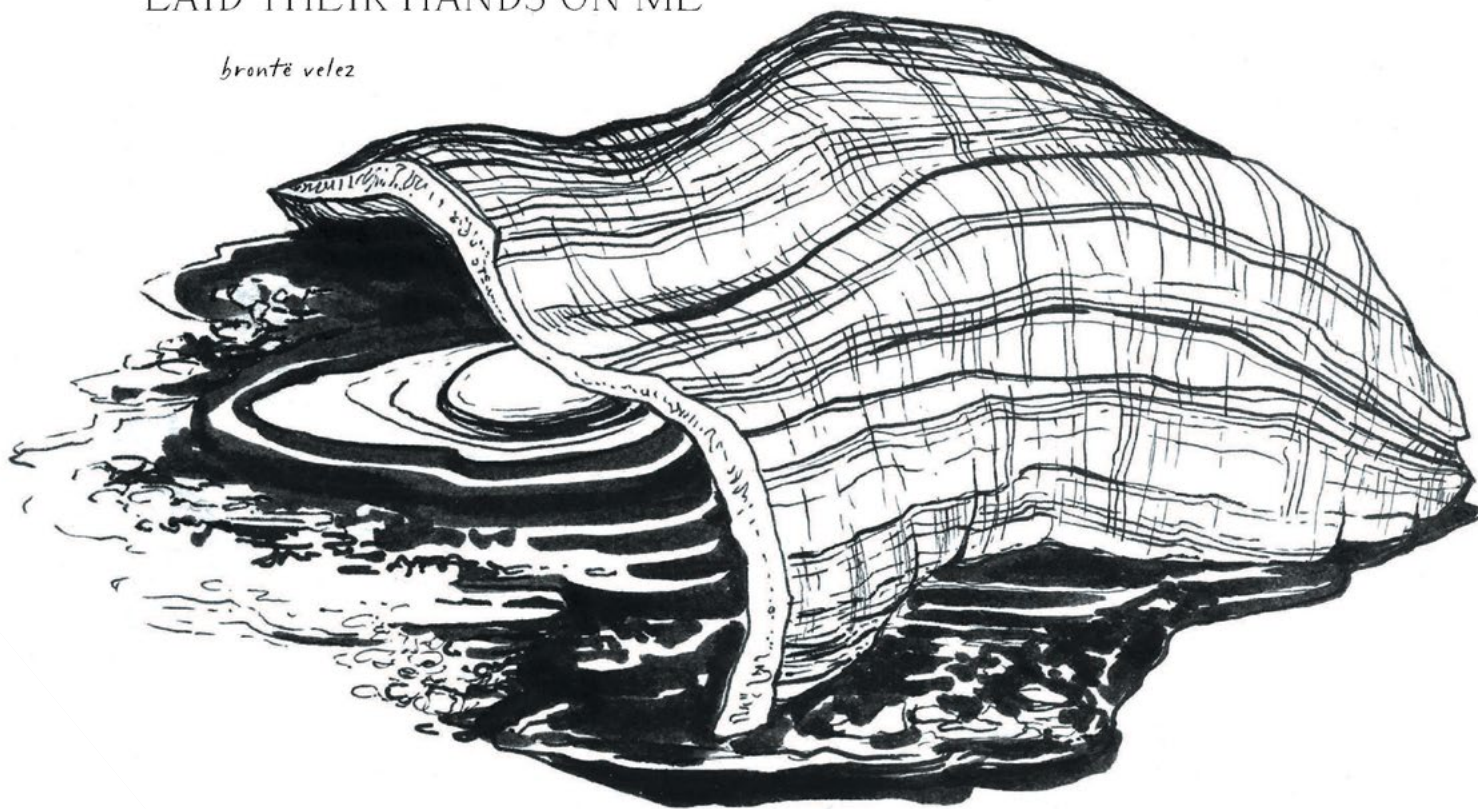

Tracing lines of living reciprocity between humans, creatures, elements and Earth

Founded in 2014, For The Wild is a progressive, slow media platform dedicated to ecological thought, cultural transformation, and the protection of the more-than-human world. Through its podcast and multimedia storytelling, it convenes artists, scientists, philosophers, Indigenous leaders and grassroots organizers to explore conservation, social justice and spiritual ecology. Emerging from a critique of dominant cultural narratives, the project imagines alternatives rooted in reciprocity with the Earth. Guided by a “slow media” ethos, the collective emphasizes depth, care and meaningful dialogue over rapid content cycles.

This is the first print publication to come out of the project, furthering its vision. *Slow Earth Companion* is a print anthology of essays, reflections, poetry and artwork by many practitioners and relevant thinkers, longtime For The Wild guests and collaborators. Entwined throughout are sensorial drawings by Krista Dragomer that hum with elemental entanglement and more-than-human presence. The anthology embraces an unconventional, textural and at times strangely feral sensibility, weaving visual and literary elements in unexpected ways. Its form and voice position it as a distinctive, memorable offering within the contemporary publishing landscape. The book is designed as a companion volume, meant to be returned to over time, exploring themes of relationship, land, kinship, belonging and ecological intimacy. It reflects the slow media and long-form editorial approach that has defined For The Wild since its founding.

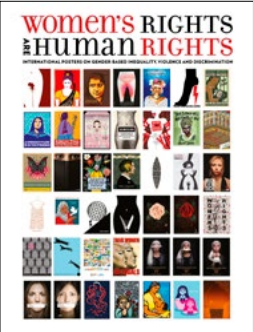

Gender inequalities remain deeply entrenched in every society. Across the globe, women still lack access to decent work and face occupational segregation and gender wage disparities. Women are often denied access to basic education and health care, suffer from violence and discrimination, and are under-represented in political and economic decision-making processes. 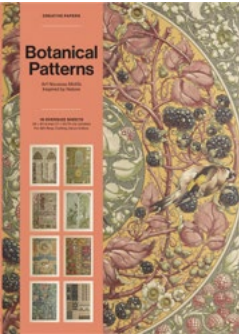

Part book-object, part specimen, part photobook: a conceptually idiosyncratic and formally elegant celebration of one of the most iconic typefaces from the 20th century

In 1961, IBM unveiled the Selectric Typewriter, featuring a revolutionary type “golf ball” that replaced the traditional typebar mechanism. To expand their font catalog and promote this new technology, IBM enlisted Adrian Frutiger to adapt his iconic Univers, modifying it to suit the machine’s specific constraints and metrics. The result was an alternate version of Univers with unit-based spacing, marking an exciting and distinct departure from conventional monospaced type. To Frutiger, the font’s charmingly uneven rhythm uniquely combined mechanical precision with a human touch. In 2025, Source Type released a rare cut of the Swiss classic by Frutiger faithfully digitized and carefully re-engineered for today’s typographic universe. Designed by Laurenz Brunner, this new UN-11 was received with considerable acclaim. Today, UN-11’s idiosyncrasies stand out in a world of polished interfaces, rounded corners and total easing. The IBM Selectric “golfball” serves as the starting point for this book: a photographic series of objects that share intriguing formal and scalar similarities with it. The book itself is equally distinctive, taking the form of a miniature hardcover measuring approximately 2.5 x 3 inches.

Rich ornamental nature designs produced at the dawn of Art Nouveau, ripe for repurposing

German decorative artist Anton Seder (1850–1916) was a figurehead of the Art Nouveau and Jugendstil styles and one of its most profound influencers. He served as Director of the Applied Art School in Strasbourg and published many highly sought-after and lavishly produced design albums. *Die Pflanze*, an album of vibrant lithographs printed in Vienna in the late 1880s, epitomizes Seder’s ornate and detailed style, with motifs drawn from nature. With lush foliage, twisting vines and enchanting woodland creatures, the intricate surface illustrations on view here blend architectural rigor with the graceful rhythms of the natural world. Featuring designs plucked from the pages of *Die Pflanze*, *Botanical Patterns Creative Papers* presents 16 of Seder’s designs as poster-size perforated sheets that, once removed and unfurled, capture the dramatic spirit of Art Nouveau in a generous scale and versatile format.

First published in 1856, *The Grammar of Ornament* is a landmark work of design history, offering a dazzling study of surface patterns from a wide range of cultural traditions. It was compiled by British architect and designer Owen Jones (1809–74), who had designed rooms for the 1851 Great Exhibition at the Crystal Palace and contributed to the reform of British design education. Black-and-white typography, decorative fonts and chromatic letterforms abound in perforated prints drawn from a Victorian specimen book

As cities around the world rapidly expanded throughout the 1800s, wood type emerged as a useful and economical tool in the creation of large-scale advertisements. Lighter in weight and less cumbersome than metal, it was quickly available in an explosion of expressive styles. One such treatment came from Harrild & Sons, one of London’s premier manufacturers of printing equipment, founded in 1809. These dapper and bombastic letterings—showcased in an equally attractive specimen book advertising everything from “Pomeranians” to “Canoes” to “Harmonics”—are the inspiration for this volume of Letterform Archive’s Creative Papers series. The 16 oversize perforated sheets contained within this booklet can be torn out and used in a variety of ways: as wrapping paper, wall art, scrapbook material and more. Each design attests to wood type’s rich and enduring appeal in both commercial and creative spheres.

MOP ART

by Marion Deuchars

Mop Art is a form of outdoor water painting, large-scale and mess-free. All you need is a mop, a bucket of water, and a flat, dry surface, like a paved courtyard or a garden path. Dip the mop in water and start drawing directly on the ground. Use wide strokes and let the shapes spread. Draw letters, birds, waves, and clouds. The water marks appear for a few moments, then fade as they dry. The images disappear, but the movement remains. It's like painting with invisible ink: ephemeral, fluid, and playful. Use a paintbrush and a jar of water for a smaller-scale version.

A joyful, provocative and educational design workbook for children, created by graphic designers to spark creativity and encourage playfulness

Conceived by designer Loredana Bontempi, this book gathers a collection of graphic exercises for children. A parent herself, Bontempi found herself wondering: what if designers shared what they actually draw and make with children in their everyday life? What if they did so not through polished workshops or educational tools, but through small, direct experiences? This book proposes a form of aesthetic learning through simple acts of drawing together, cutting shapes, repeating gestures and making small adjustments until a composition starts to click into place. These exercises can be carried out at the kitchen table, on the living room floor, during a quiet afternoon or on a long train ride—whenever and wherever one has a free moment.

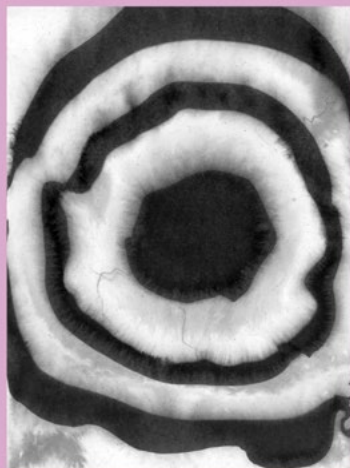
Each contributed by a graphic designer who is also a parent, the exercises in this book often depart from a simple constraint, teaching children how something like a change in scale or a different way of framing the task can redirect attention and influence how the work develops. The intention is not to make things more complex, but rather to make them more precise, holding together both perspectives: the child's curiosity and a more attentive, adult eye. The exercises focus on expression and storytelling, while elements such as form, composition, rhythm or visual balance are treated as secondary, allowing the child's imagination to take center stage. *Doing Design with Kids* is a workbook with a bold new approach that sparks creativity, joy, humor and so much more.



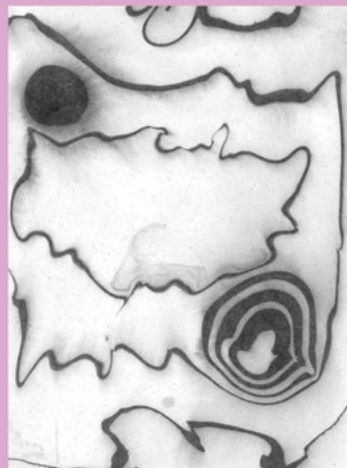

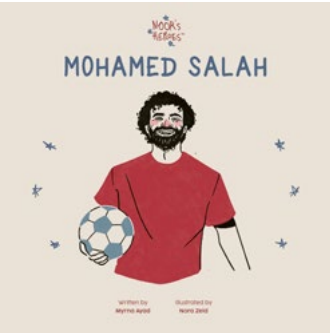

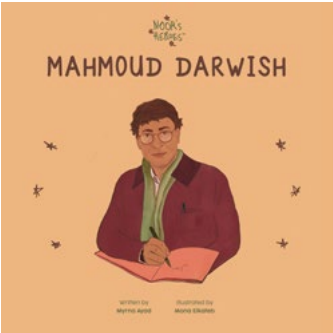

Though stateless and exiled for most of his life, Darwish used his poetry to convey Palestinian hope, identity and resistance

Considered Palestine’s national poet, Mahmoud Darwish (1941–2008) lived and wrote for his home country, even when under threat or in exile. Briefly a member of the Palestine Liberation Organization, he drafted the Palestinian Declaration of Independence in 1988. Generations of Palestinians have adopted his poems such as “Identity Card,” “I Belong There” and “To My Mother” into songs and chants, symbolizing both their ongoing repression and resistance. Darwish’s words have gained new significance in light of Israel’s ongoing genocide of the Palestinian people, evincing a flicker of hope amid systematic and unrelenting destruction. Moving yet tenderly told, this volume of Noor’s Heroes relates Darwish’s life and his legacy as a voice for the displaced.

Rising from humble beginnings to iconic status, Kulthum broke barriers, shaped music history and became a symbol of Egyptian national pride

With her sonorous, octave-gliding contralto voice—so powerful that she could perform publicly without a microphone—Umm Kulthum (1904–75) is still to this day considered the “voice of Egypt.” More than just mere entertainment or aesthetic compositions, her songs echoed with her pride for her country: from the small village where she dressed as a boy to perform to Cairo in its cinematic golden age. A strong supporter of the Egyptian military, she supported the country’s independence and its government under Gamal Abder Nasser. One of her songs even served as the Egyptian national anthem from 1960 to 1979. As *Rolling Stone* wrote, “Umm Kulthum has no real equivalent among singers in the West.” This storybook follows Kulthum from her early years to her most iconic moments, describing how she became an icon of the Arab world.

Discover the pioneer Lebanese painter and sculptor who left her mark on Arab modernism from Beirut to Cairo to Paris and beyond

Lebanese artist Saloua Raouda Choucair (1916–2017) possessed “the mind of a poet, the soul of an architect and the precision of a mathematician,” according to curator Fadia Antar. After first gaining an appreciation for Islamic art history in Egypt, Choucair traveled to Paris, where for a time she worked in the studio of painter Fernand Léger. Striving to move beyond the atelier’s conventions, she left the studio and began a sculptural practice which lasted from the 1950s to the 1980s. Her sculptures were composed of segmented wood, metal or other materials that were designed to be taken apart and reassembled piece by piece, in a tradition not dissimilar to Arabic poetry. In the final decade of Choucair’s life, her oeuvre gained international acclaim thanks to two retrospective exhibitions at the Beirut Exhibition Center and the Tate Modern.

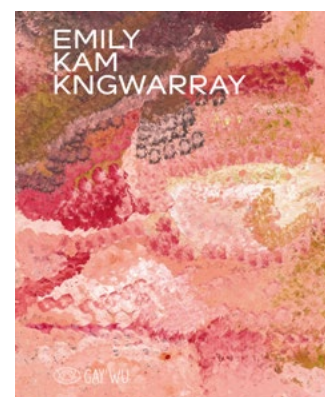
Exploring the oeuvre of a prominent Anmatyerr artist whose work defies categorization

This new volume of the Gay'Wu series, dedicated to Aboriginal arts and knowledge and published with the Swiss Fondation Opale, explores the unique practice of Anmatyerr artist Emily Kam Ngwarray, one of the most significant painters of the late 20th century. Her works, produced almost entirely in the final eight years of her life, resist containment within Western art-historical categories. They are neither abstract nor figurative in any conventional sense, neither modern nor contemporary in a linear chronology. Rather, they operate as cultural acts and visual expressions of her country, Anmatyerr law and ancestral knowledge, activated through her artistic practice. She first encountered batik in the late 1970s within the Utopia community, before turning to acrylic paint on canvas in the late 1980s. Her early works are characterized by chromatic vibrations in a restrained palette. In the final years of her life, she underwent a radical stylistic shift toward powerful compositions of lines, and an expanded use of color. Layered motifs represent the distinct wildlife and topography of the desert ecosystems around her, depicting vines, seeds, lizards and emus with expressive and gestural marks.

Born in the Sandover region of Australia's Northern Territory, **Emily Kam Ngwarray** (ca. 1914–96) began painting at around the age of 74. Though active for less than a decade, she created an estimated 3,000 works. She posthumously represented Australia at the 1997 Venice Biennale.

Taryn Simon: Father Country I Do Love You

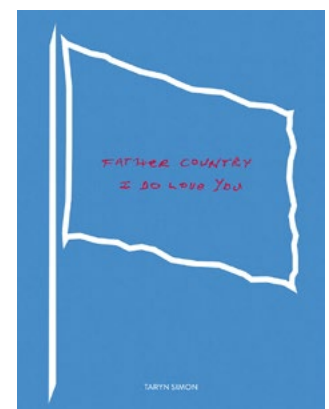
The most expansive project to date from an interdisciplinary artist whose work centers on storytelling, redirecting our attention to the unseen

This artist's book premieres a new body of work by artist Taryn Simon—her most expansive and personal project to date—which will be the subject of a major exhibition at the Guggenheim New York. Nearly a decade in the making, *Father Country I Do Love You* traces the life of an unnamed federal agent through 42 chapters, bringing together hundreds of photographs alongside text, video and sculpture works. In this labyrinth of stories, Simon uncovers the ripple effects of her protagonist's actions and inactions, intertwining accounts of victims, predators, survivors, and the mechanics of justice. This narrative is shadowed by the life of Simon's father, who lived in Thailand and traveled to Russia, Iran, Israel, China, Afghanistan, Korea and elsewhere while working for the US government, before ending his career manufacturing and selling arcade games. Simon never got his full story, but America, he always said, was the best story on earth, if you could find someone to tell it.

Taryn Simon (born 1975) has been the subject of monographic exhibitions at the Museum of Modern Art, New York (2012); Tate Modern (2011); Neue Nationalgalerie (2011); and the Whitney Museum of American Art (2007). Her work is in the permanent collections of the Metropolitan Museum of Art, Tate Modern, the Whitney Museum of American Art, Centre Georges Pompidou and Museum of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles, and was included in the 54th Venice Biennale in 2011 and the Carnegie International in 2013. She is a graduate of Brown University and a former Guggenheim Fellow.

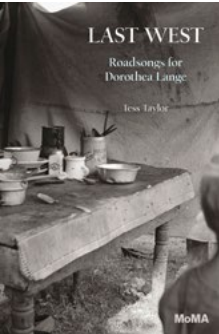

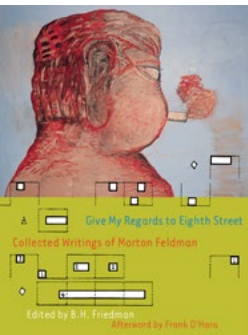

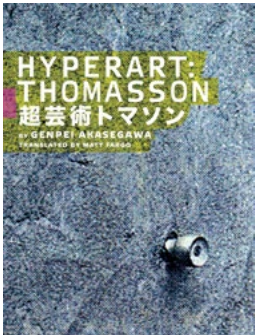

Morton Feldman is among the most influential American composers of the 20th century, a man whose music is known for its extreme quiet and delicate beauty. Karlheinz Stockhausen once asked the composer what his “secret” was. “I don’t push the sounds around,” Feldman replied. His writings resemble his music in their quiet steadiness, their oscillations between assertion and doubt. They are also funny and illuminating, not only about his own music but about the entire New York School of painters, poets and composers that coalesced in the 1950s. *Give My Regards to Eighth Street* is an authoritative collection of Feldman’s writings, culled from published articles, program notes, LP liners, lectures, interviews and unpublished writings. It is one of those rare books from which anyone can draw inspiration, no matter what the vocation or discipline. **Morton Feldman** (1926–87) was born in Queens. As a member of the New York School, which also included composers such as John Cage, he also drew influence from his Abstract Expressionist contemporaries Jackson Pollock and Mark Rothko.

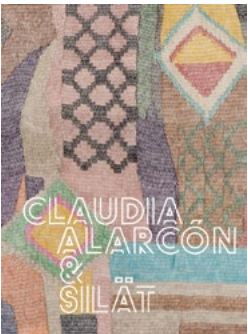

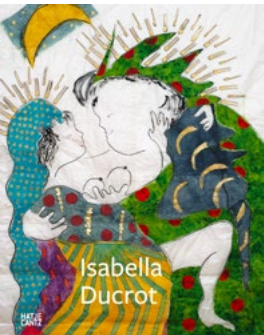

Inside the collective and communal practice of Silät, a group of women creating contemporary textiles from Wichí mythology and local materials

The ancestral power of the act of weaving lies at the core of the work of Claudia Alarcón & Silät, a collective of weavers from the Wichí people. Formed in 2023, the group currently comprises more than 100 women who live in the province of Salta in northern Argentina. Under the leadership of Indigenous artist Claudia Alarcón (born 1989), these weavers from the Alto la Sierra and La Puntana Wichí communities developed a technique in which a single piece may be worked on collectively. 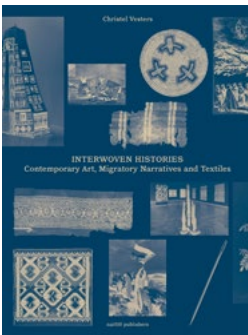

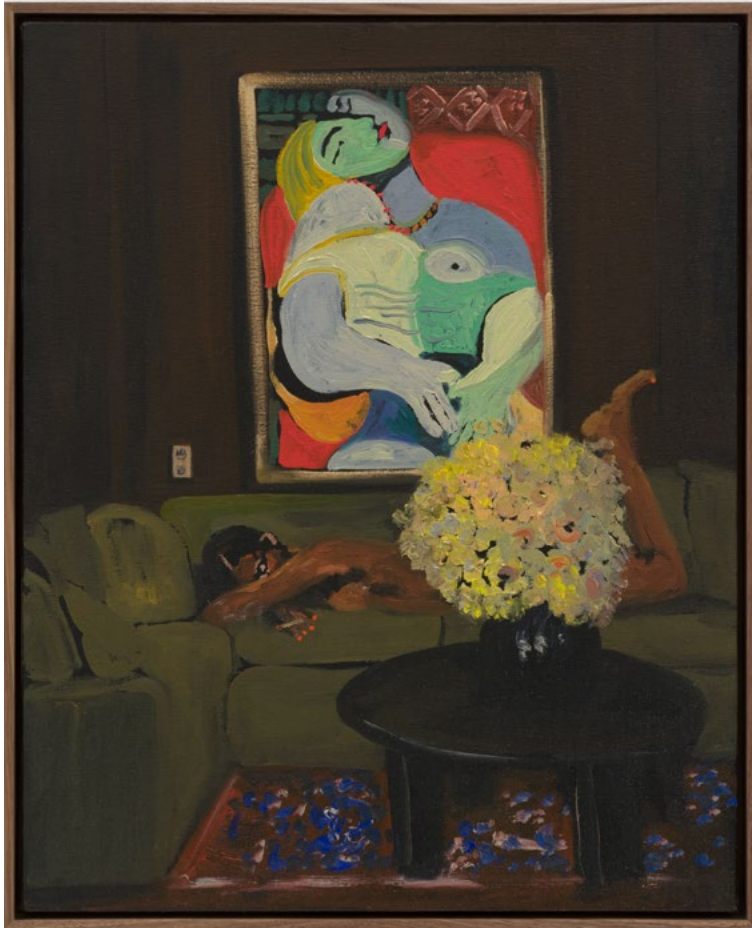

Danielle McKinney is known for her paintings that depict female subjects in moments of solitude. Published in conjunction with the traveling exhibition of the same name—the most comprehensive survey of the artist's practice to date—*Shelter* spans the last seven years of McKinney's practice. Organized into five interconnected chapters—Glow, Witness, Nocturne, Exhale and Epilogue—these sections trace a progression from the physical encounter within the paintings' settings to the psychological grounding of a subject's deep self-actualization.

The women in McKinney's paintings possess a timeless quality, often situated within familiar domestic scenes that evoke a subtle nostalgia. While viewers may recognize the intimate spaces or the emotions reflected in the subjects' knowing glances, the paintings also maintain a distance. McKinney balances this deep emotional resonance with the essential unknowability of the subject, reminding us that the full familiarity of another's inner world remains outside our reach. This tension between the known experience and the private self creates a magnetic pull, transforming moments of quiet introspection into meditations on beauty, respite and the universal need for both.

Danielle McKinney (born 1981) was born in Montgomery, Alabama, and is now based in New Jersey. Though she painted from a young age, McKinney was formally trained as a photographer. Her work is held in the collections of the Norton Museum of Art, Pérez Art Museum Miami, the Buffalo AKG Art Museum, the Dallas Museum of Art, the Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden and the Studio Museum in Harlem, among others.

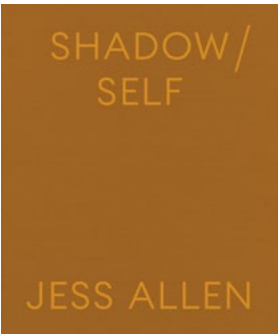

Himid’s subversive paintings of skeptical workers question whether Britain is truly welcoming to immigrants, and whether they feel they belong

In her paintings, prints and installations, Zanzibari-born British artist Lubaina Himid (born 1954) investigates race, feminism and cultural memory, particularly the overlooked influence of Black immigrants on Western culture. 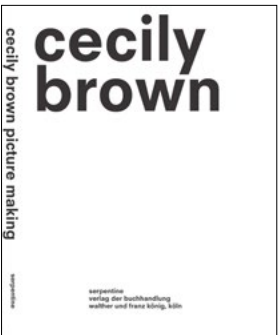

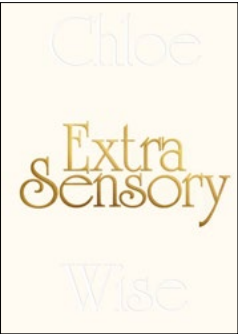

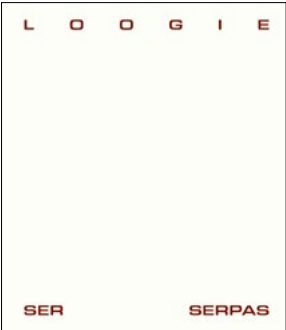

Recent film output from the New York–based artist whose work engages with the absurdities of digital culture and mass consumerism

In *Extra Sensory*, Canadian-born artist Chloe Wise (born 1990) explores how we perceive reality and what remains concealed beyond the limits of sense and language. The book is published to accompany the artist’s solo show at KBH.G, which presents her most expansive film project to date: a multichannel video installation enveloping the viewer in a shifting, cinematic environment. Wise introduces figures that evoke angels, supernatural beings or technological apparitions, yet present themselves as unstable constructs. The exhibition understands perception not as a neutral reception of reality, but as an active, mediating process shaped by language, history and cultural expectations. The publication mirrors this atmosphere, reflecting on recent directions in Wise’s practice and her interest in the outer edges of human knowledge. With contributions from a diverse group—ranging from critics Gideon Jacobs and Piper Marshall to scholars such as Diana Walsh-Pasulka and even psychic mediums—the publication presents Wise’s latest artistic production in a fresh, original way.

An extensive survey of the challenging work of an artist pushing forward the relationship between the body, the environment and art

This volume is the most comprehensive publication to date on the work of Los Angeles–born artist Ser Serpas (born 1995), whose oeuvre incorporates corporeal and poetic forms of expression across both painting and sculpture. *Loogie* traces the first decade of the artist’s multidisciplinary practice antichronologically, bringing together 650 illustrations alongside newly commissioned texts. Her work investigates boundaries between the body (most often represented nude and fragmented), time and the ephemeral images that lie in-between, as well as the notions of identity, intimacy, sexuality and theatricality. Her sculptures are built around discarded objects that bear the traces of their past uses—a collection of disparate elements that she assembles to create free-standing works playing with materiality and transformation as the “aftermath of a private performance or choreography.” She considers this process of composition a crucial phase of her process, as the objects acquire new significance when brought together.

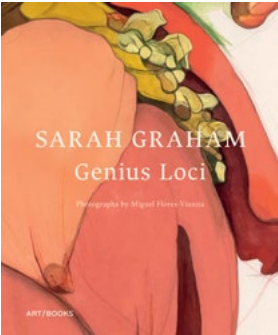

Poblete’s performative, transdisciplinary work draws on her Indigenous and queer heritage to unpack the affects of colonialism

Argentinian artist La Chola Poblete (born 1989) initially adopted the name Chola as an alter ego for performances and later as her identity. The term “chola” refers to women of Indigenous descent and originated as a racial slur in Peru and Bolivia, where the artist’s ancestors came from. Poblete uses this narrative to deconstruct stereotypes produced about her community and history. Working across painting, sculpture, drawing, photography, video and performance, her works frequently appropriate those of other artists, mixing patterns and characters that are sometimes also reproduced on the exhibition walls. This is La Chola Poblete’s most comprehensive book and accompanies her exhibition at the Museu de Arte de São Paulo Assis Chateaubriand (MASP). With 140 images, three critical essays and the artist’s manifesto, it is an indispensable publication for those interested in contemporary LGBTQIA+ and Latin American artists.

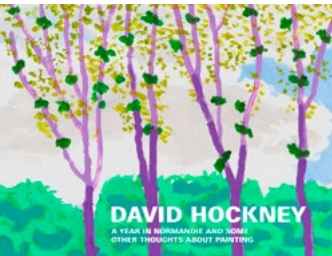

Working in situ in the wilderness, Graham pushes the boundaries of gesture and abstraction through subtle ink washes, stains and seepages

Taking plant and animal forms as her primary source, British artist Sarah Graham (born 1973) focuses on one flower, insect or skeletal structure, examining it from every perspective. In 2025, she drastically shifted studios—moving from her London workspace to a makeshift site in the Kenyan wilderness. Using limited materials, she created a powerful series of drawings and paintings revealing both the wonder and strangeness of the natural world. This beautifully illustrated publication chronicles Graham’s voyage of discovery as she painted and drew alongside roaming wild animals and local Samburu tribesmen. 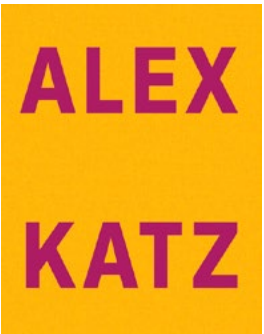

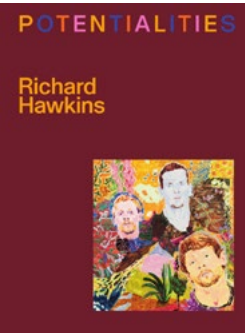

An unstoppable Alex Katz continues to test the conventions of his own signature figurative style

For the better part of his seven-decade career, American painter Alex Katz (born 1927) has been recognized for his detached, minimalist paintings of figures, objects and nature rendered in swaths of richly hued color. 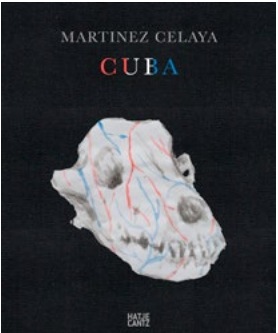

Since the early 1990s, Texas-born artist Richard Hawkins (born 1961) has developed a singular practice based upon the intense pleasure of looking and the dynamics of desire. Martínez Celaya's interdisciplinary works meditate on themes of exile and the fantasy of return

This volume brings together three major exhibitions by the Cuban American painter Enrique Martínez Celaya (born 1964), each dedicated to Cuba: *Los muertos llaman al alba*, *The Word-Shimmering Sea* and *The Sextant*. One hundred years ago, 22-year-old Willem de Kooning (1904–97) left the quays of his hometown of Rotterdam for New York City. 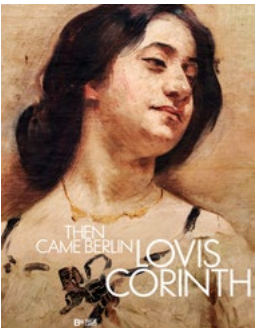

Exploring the influences of and on Berlin in the career of one of the most important representatives of German Impressionism

The significance of Lovis Corinth (1858–1925) to Modernism can hardly be overstated. Even during his lifetime, the painter was among the most prominent figures in the Berlin art scene. Born and raised in Tapiau, East Prussia, he moved from Munich to the imperial capital in 1900. At that time, Berlin was already significantly more progressive than the Bavarian residence city. 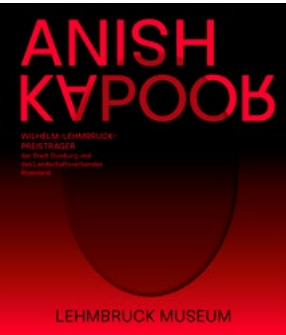

This volume is published following the major exhibition of the same name works by the American artist Jack White (born 1975), which took place at Damien Hirst’s Newport Street Gallery in London. The exhibition marked White’s first public showing of his art and includes works made by the artist over the last 30 years, from sculpture and installations to furniture design products. 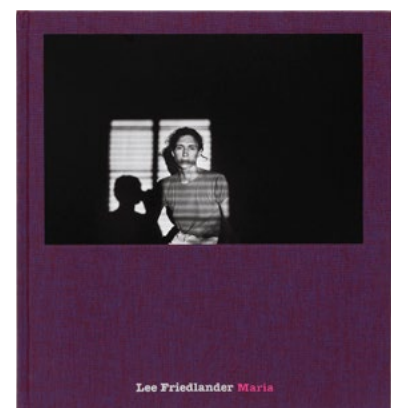

Known for his complex photographs of the American social landscape, Lee Friedlander has also photographed his wife, Maria, for many years, directing his relentlessly curious eye to a subject he approaches with tenderness, awe and amusement. *Maria* presents a seven-decade extended portrait of the artist's wife, bringing together more than 70 images tracing the arc of their relationship, through marriage, parenthood, grandparenthood and beyond. On the surface, the pictures catalog the stuff of everyday life: Maria reading, driving, talking on the phone, lying in the sun, reading another book. Sometimes Maria serves as a muse in the traditional sense, with a composition that is nothing more than a man marveling at his wife. Many images reflect Friedlander's sustained appreciation for his wife's self-possessed style. But eventually, the portraits begin to take on the attributes of Friedlander's idiosyncratic approach to image-making—shadows, objects and reflections intrude, and certain images appear as fractured as cracked plates. Collecting photographs made over the course of a rich and complicated partnership, the book reflects the particular triumphs and mysteries of life with an artist.

Lee Friedlander (born 1934) has published more than 60 monographs since 1969. He was represented alongside Diane Arbus and Garry Winogrand in the 1967 New Documents exhibition at the Museum of Modern Art, New York, now understood as a landmark event in American documentary photography, and received his own retrospective at the same museum in 2005. He has lived and worked in New York since 1956.

In commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the Lebanese Civil War, Boston-based photographer Rania Matar (born 1964) collaborated with young Lebanese women to visualize their life stories and complex relationships to their beautiful, war-torn homeland. 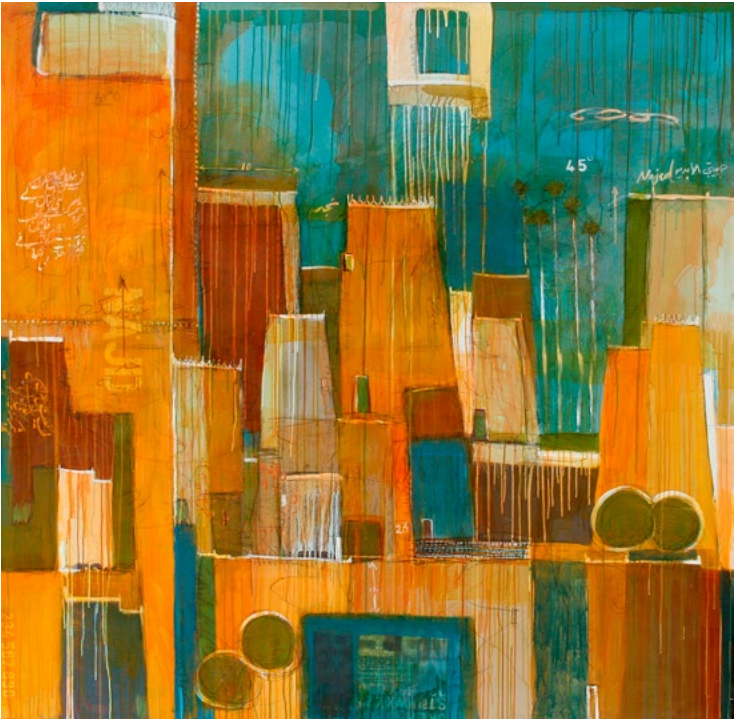

The reception of art without the postcard is almost inconceivable, whether through museum postcards reproducing celebrated works, gallery invitation cards or editions created by artists themselves. Yet the postcard has received far less attention as an artistic medium in its own right. This publication explores how artists have used postcards not simply as vehicles for reproduction or communication, but as conceptual tools that question authorship, circulation, institutional frameworks and the experience of art. Focusing on projects from the early 1960s onward, it examines works by On Kawara, Lawrence Weiner, Susan Hiller, Marcel Broodthaers, Michael Asher and Mathilde ter Heijne. Through close analysis, the book demonstrates how these artists employed the postcard to construct self-reflective artistic practices while engaging with broader cultural and political contexts. Their projects reveal the postcard as both an everyday object and a powerful medium for rethinking contemporary art and its institutions.
