

LESSON PLANNING

Each bar on the charts represents a time frame in which the topic is introduced, practiced and mastered.



These charts will provide you with a frame work for using MathMedia Reading and Thinking Series Software to improve reading comprehension and critical thinking skills.

Please note that topics can be introduced, practiced and mastered concurrently.

STUDENT PLACEMENT AND EVALUATION

Students may be placed according to their grade level reading ability. Each section is scored and scores are reported to the included Learning Management System (LMS). Based upon the student's scores, you may decide to remediate the student to earlier sections. In general, students find these learning activities interesting and they enjoy doing topics that are both easy and challenging. Starting students in the easier levels will encourage them and acquaint them with the nature of critical thinking. There is also a readiness factor. Students who may not have the ability to understand or read at a given level return in subsequent months (or years) to find the material more understandable.
