SIMMONS NAMED TO HEAD IDAHO LOTTERY.

Idaho Governor Dirk Kempthorne appointed former Ada County Commissioner Roger Simmons as the new executive director for the Idaho Lottery. Simmons comes to the Lottery with vast experience in leadership positions. Interim Director Steve Woodall returns to his post as Deputy Director. In addition to his most recent responsibilities as a commissioner from 1993 to present, Simmons has served as the chairman and board member of several associations including the Community Planning Association, the Idaho Association of Counties and the National Association of Counties Economic Development Subcommittee. His prior experience also includes general manager of the Western Idaho Fair in Boise and reporter for KTVB-Channel 7 in Boise, where he earned more than 50 awards for investigative reporting.

LA ROP PROGRAM A BIG SUCCESS. ROP, the Retail Optimization Program developed by the Louisiana Lottery Corporation (LLC) and GTECH to help retailers increase on-line and instant sales, is reportedly going well. The purpose of ROP is to develop customized research information to help individual retailers predict potential, realistic product sales. Lottery CSRs were assigned over 500 of the Lottery's 3,000 retailers considered to have the greatest potential to improve their sales. Of the retailers involved in the ROP program, 78% increased their total weekly sales from the previous fiscal year. This increase was consistent for both on-line and instant products.

MT HOUSE ENDORSES INTERNATIONAL GAMES.

Montana lawmakers approved a bill allowing the state's Lottery to participate in international lottery games. The measure passed 55-45. Many in favor of the measure felt it was needed for the state to continue to sell Powerball in the event that other countries join the game. The Mexican National Lottery has reportedly expressed in interest in joining Powerball.

MD GOV AIMS FOR SLOTS. In an effort to generate \$600 million in state revenue, Maryland Gov. Robert L. Ehrlich Jr. will propose a plan to install 13,500 slot machines at three racetrack in Central Maryland. His plan also envisions up to 2,500 more machines at a track near Cumberland at a later date.

NC BILL TO FILE AGAIN. Rep. Bill Owens, a North Carolina Lottery supporter, will file a new lottery bill when the General Assembly returns to work, but it doesn't look as if the bill will get much support. The state House rejected a lottery referendum last year, and while some who voted against it last year may have changed their mind, the general consensus is that lottery efforts lost ground in the 2002 elections.

HOOSIER TICKET MAY FUND PRESCRIPTIONS. The Indiana General Assembly will vote to create a new lottery game that would allocate \$1 from each \$2 ticket to the HoosierRx program, which provides half-priced prescriptions to poor, elderly residents. The HoosieRx program is currently funded by the state's \$7 million share of the national tobacco settlement.

PA SEEKS MIDDAY DRAWINGS. The Pennsylvania Lottery wants to add a midday drawing for two of its games, the "Daily Number" and the "Big 4." The plan needs the approval of Gov.-elect Ed Rendell's administration. If approval is granted, the extra drawings could come as early as February.

CA ANNOUNCES XTRA REWARDS. The California Lottery announced that Xtra Reward, a special promotion for the SuperLotto Plus game, will be held from January 18 - February 22. Two eight-digit numbers will be drawn every Wednesday and Saturday giving players two chances to win \$50,000 for every single draw. Each time a player buys 5 to 10 SuperLotto Plus plays, for one draw on a single ticket, they automatically receive one to three free Xtra Reward numbers. The Xtra Reward number is a unique eight-digit number, which will appear on the bottom of each ticket.

LA TEAMS WITH HORNETS. The Louisiana Lottery is now a corporate sponsor of the New Orleans Hornets for the 2002 - 2003 basketball season. As part of the partnership, the LLC airs commercials during all radio broadcasts; features ticket discount promotions using non-winning Lottery tickets, and Lottery signs are displayed in the court area and various other areas of the arena. Also, a full-page color ad will appear in every issue of "The Buzz," the official team magazine of the Hornets. In addition, Lottery tickets will be sold in the gift shop at Hornets' games and all other public events in the New Orleans Arena. The LLC will also participate in one community program in conjunction with the NBA and the Hornets.

TENNESSEE VOTE ON OPERATIONS. The Tennessee Lottery Implementation Committee is expected to vote in early February to hire a private

corporation to run its state lottery instead of having it run by a state agency. The legislation is modeled after the Georgia Lottery plan.

SWISS LOTTERIES UNITE. The operating divisions of the three German speaking lottery companies in Switzerland, Sport-Toto-Gesellschaft (STG), the Interkantonale Landeslotterie (ILL) and the SEVA lottery have merged to one single lottery company. This new company, named SWISSLOS, has his head office at Basel, Lange Gasse 10, the same address as the Sport-Toto-Gesellschaft and the WLA office in Switzerland. President of SWISSLOS is Mr. Georg Kennel, former President of STG.

FRANCE LAUNCHES COTE & MATCH. La Française des Jeux launched a fixed-odds betting game based on French and International soccer matches: The game, Cote & Match, resembles other Fixed odd games in Europe, and is the second sports betting game after the traditional Loto Foot (football pools) which remains in FDJ's range of products. In Cote & Match, player's choose from 3 to 6 games from an official weekly list of 60 (or 40) French and/or International soccer events, wagers from 1 to 100 and finally forecasts the results on a 1N2 basis (home win, tie, away win). Net prize payout to players is 60%. There is also a "Lucky Number" draw which enlarge the chances to win. In a related story, Access Gaming Systems announced the successful début in France of 'Cote & Match' football betting on the Internet using the AGS system.

COMPANY ANNOUNCEMENTS

ICELAND INKS INTERLOTT. Interlott received an order from the University of Iceland Lottery for the purchase of Compact Dispensing System ITVMs. The order is the first for Interlott's new four-bin compact ITVM, which can be mounted on a wall or placed on a pedestal. Delivery is scheduled for February.

IDAHO EXTENDS OGT. Oberthur announced a oneyear contract extension with the Idaho Lottery that will extend the contract until September 30, 2003 for instant ticket services and supplies. Oberthur and the Idaho Lottery began their partnership in 1989.

INTRALOT IN POLAND. Intralot has been awarded a ten-year contract from the Polish State Lottery "Polski Monopol Loteryjny" for the operation of instant tickets. The remuneration of Intralot is based on percentage of games' turnover.

MDI SIGNS FRANKIE AND ANNETTE. Scientific Games announced that its wholly owned subsidiary MDI Entertainment has finalized agreement on a licensing program for Frankie Avalon and Annette Funicello trademarked as Frankie and Annette's Beach Blanket Bingo for lottery games and promotions. The agreement with Allstate Gaming, Inc. grants MDI and its customers the right to use the likenesses of the stars and animation in advertising and point of sale promotional materials. In addition, live appearances of Frankie Avalon may be included in promotional agreements for the games. The worldwide licensing contract runs from January 1, 2003 through 2005.

OREGON SIGNS WITH PTI. The Oregon Lottery has signed an agreement with PTI (formerly Promo-Travel International) to release 3 Partner Promotions over the next 12 months and is finalizing plans for a 4th for 2004. The properties include Pyramid®, Let it Ride®, Bahama Bonus™ and Fantasy Island®, the last two of which will include fantasy vacations to the Bahamas and Hawaii.

WI WITHDRAWS CONTRACT. GTECH announced that the Wisconsin Department of Revenue notified interested vendors of its decision to discontinue the current RFP for a new online and instant-ticket lottery system and related telecommunications network, and withdrew its notice of intent to negotiate a new contract with GTECH. As a result, the Department rejected all proposals and indicated it will release new RFPs.

LOTTERY PEOPLE

UK's National Lottery Commission has appointed **Catherine Forrester** to the new role of Director of Performance and Communications. The role has been created to allow a more comprehensive and independent view to be taken of the performance achieved by the operator of the National Lottery. She is responsible for a small team and reports directly to the Chief Executive. Prior to joining the Commission Catherine was Performance Assurance Manager with Elexon.

The New Zealand Lotteries Commission announced the appointment of **Mr. Trevor Hall**, a former Chief Executive Officer of Totally Wellington, as their new Chief Executive.

Tennessee is bordered by nine other states, five of which have lotteries - Georgia, Illinois, Kentucky, Missouri, and South Carolina and by four non-lottery states - Alabama, Arkansas, Mississippi and North Carolina. As a result, Tennessee has the potential of gaining more revenues from adjacent states than any previous lottery state. Tennessee will regain revenues currently being lost because of Tennesseans buying lottery tickets in adjacent lottery states. In addition, Tennessee will gain revenues because of lottery customers being drawn from adjacent non-lottery states to buy Tennessee lottery tickets. Tennessee also has the advantage of having many of its citizens already educated on how to play lottery games as a result of them having played in adjacent lottery states. Tennessee has the prospect of having a very successful lottery.
