COMPANY ANNOUNCEMENTS

CA CHOOSES SCIENTIFIC GAMES. Scientific Games has been awarded the contract to provide the California State Lottery with instant lottery tickets and marketing services beginning July 1, 2005. Scientific Games will provide the Lottery with 75% of its instant products for a base term of four years. The contract contains four one-year options to extend. The California State Lottery is projected to reach a total of \$3.3 billion in total sales with \$1.7 billion in instant sales for fiscal year 2005 generating \$1 billion for public education. Since its creation in 1985, the lottery has contributed more than \$15 billion to California's public schools.



VEIKKAUS OY. GTECH has entered into a joint venture agreement with Veikkaus Oy, the operator of the Finnish national lottery, to develop and market innovative new games and solutions for the lottery and gaming industries. The primary focus of the joint venture is the development of government-sponsored games and solutions over expanding interactive channels such as Internet, mobile telephony, and interactive television, with a main emphasis on sports betting. GTECH will hold an 81 percent equity stake in the joint venture, with the remaining 19 percent held by Veikkaus. The joint venture will be located in Finland, and initially staffed by Veikkaus personnel. The joint venture agreement is expected to close and be operational in the third quarter of this fiscal year, subject to certain closing

conditions in the agreement.

SHANGHAI WELFARE LOTTERY



AWARDS TWO CONTRACTS TO SCIENTIFIC GAMES. The Shanghai Welfare Lottery Issuing Center (SWLIC

Welfare Lottery Issuing Center (SWLIC) has awarded Scientific Games two contracts with a combined valued of \$40 million over ten years. Under the new online lottery agreement, Scientific Games will maintain SWLIC's online lottery software and supply 4,000 new online lottery terminals. Under the first agreement, Scientific Games will supply keno game software and provide 1,000 keno terminals. Of the 4,000 online lottery terminals Scientific Games is providing under the second agreement, 2,100 represent an expansion of the current network while the remaining

1,900 terminals will upgrade older machines. The 1,000 keno terminals will be installed at new retailers who sell only keno games. Both contracts commence July 1, 2005.



SHUFFLE MASTER, IGT AND PROGRESSIVE GAMING ANNOUNCE WORLDWIDE PRODUCT INTEGRATION AGREEMENT. Shuffle Master, IGT and Progressive Gaming International

announced a worldwide product integration agreement to create a comprehensive, automated table management solution using complementary capabilities, technologies, and resources of the three companies. Under the terms of the agreement, Shuffle Master will be the provider of automatic card shufflers, card reading intelligent shoes, card and chip sorters and verifiers. IGT will be the provider of back-end table gaming management systems, including player tracking, patron loyalty and rewards, as well as bonusing applications. Progressive Gaming will be the provider of RFID bet recognition, automated gaming chip tracking and payoff recognition. Each company will cooperatively interface their respective products into a combined product offering to be known as the Intelligent Table System. The agreement also provides a framework for the cooperative development of new technologies and products that build on automated table management and real-time monitoring of player activity.



WMS AND CYBERVIEW SIGN AGREEMENTS.

WMS Gaming entered into wide ranging technology transfer agreements with Cyberscan Technology Inc. (d/b/a Cyberview Technology). Under the terms of the agreements, WMS has purchased the latest versions of Cyberview's server-based and downloadable gaming systems and related technologies. The non-exclusive agreements also give WMS the right to create derivative versions of these systems and to use, sell, lease, export or distribute the Cyberview technologies in all gaming markets, subject to certain restrictions including time and product restrictions on entry into certain markets. In addition, Cyberview has granted WMS a non-exclusive, perpetual, irrevocable, worldwide license to its technology patent portfolio related to serverbased gaming. Cyberview will provide WMS' system technology team with initial technical and functional support to enable WMS to operate, maintain and further develop these technologies. WMS has also entered into a five-year agreement to license certain of its game content to Cyberview on a royalty-based, recurring revenue basis for use in lottery markets and certain other non-casino markets outside of North America. Cyberview will be paid total cash consideration of \$15 million over 2 years for these agreements and WMS has been granted certain rights of first refusal relating to common shares of Cyberscan Technology held by Jean-Marie Gatto and Sylvie Linard.

Progress Real Time Division announced that its innovative PeerDirect® database replication and data synchronization technology has been integrated into Cole Systems' OrderPad Enterprise™ mobile sales force automation software. network. More than 430 lottery sales representatives in Indiana, New York, Pennsylvania and Kentucky are using OrderPad to manage the entire sales process from a single mobile device, the Tablet PC. OrderPad Enterprise, the first Tablet PC-optimized mobile sales software, allows sales representatives to manage the entire sales process from a single device.



PIXIEM/WIN WIN LAUNCH "WIMBLEDON 2005".

Pixiem, Inc., a wholly-owned subsidiary of Win Win Gaming, Inc., announced the launch of Wimbledon's first officially licensed cell phone tennis game, "Wimbledon 2005," in North America and Europe through lead mobile carriers Verizon and Cingular. "Wimbledon 2005" was developed under license from the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club Ltd. ("All England Tennis Club"), the organizer of the annual Wimbledon Lawn Tennis Championships. Included in the exclusive three-year licensing deal are performance goals and revenue sharing based on royalties. "Wimbledon 2005" offers a realistic virtual tennis experience for cell phone players. Players can adjust the velocity of their serves, attack the net, and add spin to their shots. "Wimbledon 2005" also offers four levels of increasing difficulty starting with Club Challenge, moving up to Open Crown, then Royal Cup, and ending with The Wimbledon Championship.

On June 20, Scientific Games Corporation appointed Michael Chambrello, formerly a top executive at GTECH, as its president and chief operating officer. The appointment splits off the role of president from A. Lorne Weil, who will continue as Scientific Games chairman and chief executive. Weil said the change will allow him to focus more on future development opportunities, while Chambrello will concentrate more on daily operations, though there will be overlap. Asked about specific development plans, Weil said the company hopes to expand its horse-race betting business to other sports and continues to search out acquisition prospects. Chambrello most recently served as president and CEO of a private environmental testing company called Environmental Systems Products. He previously held the position of president of GTECH Corp. and executive vice president of GTECH Holdings Corp. Chambrello will start in his new role on July 1.

The European Lotteries Association's (EL) General Assembly appointed **Doctor Winfried Wortmann**, General Director of the Westdeutsche Lottery of Münster/Germany as its new President. Dr. Wortmann, succeeds **Mr. Hans-Jürgen Reißiger**, of Deutsche Klassenlotterie, Berlin, who after 4 years did not run again for election. Dr. Wortmann is 58 years old, and has been working with the Westdeutsche Lotterie since1994 Ten Executive Committee Members were also elected during this assembly: **Mr. Christophe**

Blanchard-Dignac, President-General Director de la Française des Jeux / France, was appointed 1st Vice-President and Mr. Sotiris Koulossoussas, Member of the Board and President of 'Sports Business Partnership,' Greek Organization of Football Prognostics OPAP / Greece, was appointed 2nd Vice-President. Mr. Hans-Jürgen Reißiger was nominated "Honorary President" by the General Assembly named in acknowledgement of his successful work for enhancing awareness in the domain of State Lotteries in Europe. Win Win Gaming, Inc. named Mark Galvin, formerly Director of Development for Electronic Arts Inc., to the position of Chief Operating Officer. Galvin brings more than 20 years of domestic and international experience in the areas of content development, technical support, production, finance, operations, and administration for companies engaged in game production, creative media. visual effects, animation, and TV/film production.



VIDEO GAMING/RACINOS

MGM, NYRA AGREE ON AQUEDUCT. MGM Mirage has entered into a definitive management agreement with the New York Racing Association (NYRA), under which MGM Mirage will develop and manage a 4500-unit VLT facility at Aqueduct. The project had been on hold pending favorable legislative and judicial developments in New York State, which now will permit the project to move forward. MGM Mirage's participation remains subject to New York regulatory approval. The Aqueduct facility, budgeted at \$170 million, is expected to open in mid-2006.

PA GAMING BOARD POSTS MANUFACTURER LICENSE FORMS. The Pennsylvania Supreme Court upheld most of Act 71 of 2004 permitting the expansion of gaming. In related news, the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board posted on its Web site downloadable application forms for companies and people interested in becoming licensed manufacturers of gaming equipment in the Commonwealth. The deadline for returning completed applications to the Board is Aug. 15, 2005. SVENSKA SPEL LAUNCHES MOBILE BINGO. The latest addition to games offered on your mobile phone by Svenska Spel will be Bingo says Mathias Hedlund, VP for Division Direct. Svenska Spel has had Bingo on its website for almost two years and it has proved to be a hit. Already Swedes can play two of Svenska Spel's Oddset sports betting games and the two scratch tickets '*Triss*' and '*Tia*'

on cellular phones. Svenska Spel intends to continue

launching product on mobile phones.



LOTTERY NEWS

CA LAUNCHES MEGA MILLIONS. The California Lottery launched Mega Millions on Wednesday, June 21. Lottery officials said about \$1.1 million had been spent statewide on Mega Millions tickets by mid-afternoon. By comparison, about \$1.6 million had been spent on Super Lotto tickets.

TRI-STATE TRIPLE PLAY STARTS. Tri-State Triple Play tickets went on sale Sunday, June 26 and the first drawing will be held on Tuesday, June 28th. The tickets, offered by the Maine, Vermont and New Hampshire lotteries gives three plays for \$2 and offers two play styles on one ticket, including a Base Game, which is the typical lotto style game, and a Combined Play feature. The all-cash rolling jackpot starts at \$30,000. The Vermont Lottery is supporting this new game with a variety of consumer and clerk promotions. Consumers can win a \$100 VISA gift card by displaying *Triple Play* stickers, which are available at Lottery agents. Players will also get a chance to win a free *Triple Play* ticket when playing *Megabucks* or *Powerball* June 26 through July 17. Lottery agents and their clerks can also enter to win prizes during the *Triple Play* introduction.

LOTO QUEBEC POSTS INCREASED REVENUES.

With consolidated revenues of \$3.937 billion and net income of \$1.583 billion, Loto-Québec remitted a total of \$1.511 billion in dividends to the Ouébec Government during the fiscal year ended March 31, 2005. As such, the Corporation's revenues, net income and dividends showed a 4.7%. 8% and 1.2% increase respectively as compared to the previous year. The Corporation remitted a total of \$1.669 billion in dividends, taxes and other sums directly to Government Ministries during fiscal 2004-2005. All three of Loto-Québec's principal activity sectors contributed to the increase in the Corporation's total revenues, with Lotteries, Casinos (including Restaurants and Hotels) and Video Lotteries recording increases in earnings of 2.5%, 3.3% and 9.6% respectively. With respect to net income, Lottery revenues grew by 6.9% and Video Lotteries by 11.8%, while Casinos showed a slight decline of 0.6%.

PA SCRATCHER OFFERS 20 \$1 MILLION PRIZES.

The Pennsylvania Lottery will introduce its largest instant game ever on Tuesday, June 28. "\$275 Million Cash Extravaganza" will feature 20 top prizes of \$1 million each, 12,000 prizes between \$1,000 and \$20,000 and more than

490,000 prizes from \$100 to \$500. \$275 Million Cash Extravaganza will be the Lottery's latest \$20 game. The overall odds of winning a prize are 1-in-3.06.



NM GOV NIXES CASINO/LOTTERY GAME. New

Mexico's Governor Richardson has reportedly directed the New Mexico Lottery Board to discontinue the lottery's just-released joint tribal-casino and lottery scratch ticket, LottoSino. The 'Associated Press' reported that the lottery will comply and all of the tickets will disappear when a four-month contract ends. The scratch-off game tickets featured prizes from the lottery and Santa Ana Star Casino. Richardson said he was concerned that the tickets sent a message that the state promoted casino-style gambling. Sales of the ticket began June 14th and drew quick criticism from 'New Mexico Coalition Against Gambling' director Guy Clark. He said the tickets amounted to a state endorsement of casino gambling.

MO MAKES FINAL FY05 TRANSFER. The Missouri Lottery made its final transfer of fiscal year 2005 with its

monthly transfer of \$19.5 million to the Lottery Proceeds Fund for public education. The June transfer - \$19,500,078 - is based on ticket sales in May, and it brings the total proceeds to education for fiscal year 2005 to \$218,285,010. The fiscal year total is \$3.2 million or 1.5 percent more than

the Lottery's estimated goal of \$215 million.



GREENIN' UP THE OZARKS.

On the first day of summer, a group of 21 Missouri Lottery-made millionaires and their families were

found "greenin' up the Ozarks" during a litter pick-up event on the South Creek Greenway in Springfield. The event was part of the Lottery's 19th annual millionaires' reunion. This year's attending jackpot winners represented combined winnings of more than \$242 million. The Lottery organizes the reunion and the millionaires pay their own way. There are many reasons the reunions are important, including that it is a good opportunity for the millionaires to meet others who have experienced such a sudden life change. In addition to their clean-up efforts on the Greenway, Lottery winners were presented with two seminars during the reunion: one seminar titled "The Power of Sleep" by Dr. Terrence Coulter, medical director at the CoxHealth Sleep Disorders Center in Springfield; and one seminar called "Goal Digging: Your Map to Success" presented by Geri Wiseman, professional development manager for the Missouri Lottery. The millionaires also enjoyed entertainment in Branson during

their stay, including a dinner at the Hard Luck Diner and seeing the "Lost in the '50s" show at the Starlite Theater.

NZLC LAUNCHES NON-CASH PRIZE FOR KENO.

New Zealand Lotteries Keno players could win one of 20 awesome Warriors supporter packs in the first ever non-cash prize promotion for Keno. Each pack consists of a Sony 32" FD Trinitron widescreen WEGA TV, a one year Sky Digital subscription and a signed Warriors jersey. To enter players need to buy a Keno ticket between Sunday, June 19 and Saturday, July 9. With every Keno entry into a Keno draw players will receive a voucher that puts them in the 9 July draw for the Warriors packs. The winning voucher numbers will be available in-store on Sunday, July 10 after the Saturday, July 9th 6pm draw.



POOLZCONNECT. Singapore Pools will be introducing PoolzConnect, a phone service for football betting. The Lottery will pre-launch PoolzConnect with the start of the Confederations Competition on Jun 15, 2005. Pre-launch activities include having staff at 12 selected branches (Annex A) from June 15-19 between 10 pm to 12 midnight to inform customers about PoolzConnect and to receive their feedback and indication of interest in the service. The current criteria for Singapore citizens and permanent citizens interested to use PoolzConnect service are that they must be at least 21 years of age and be able to set aside a sum of \$\$5,000 in a designated bank account. PoolzConnect customers are required to place a minimum bet amount of \$50 per call.

ALC CALL CENTER EMPLOYEES HONORED. The

Atlantic Lottery's in-house team of 40 call centre employees were honored with a Community Involvement award at the ContactNB Awards of Excellence gala. The team, called Lottery Support Services (LSS), picked up the award that recognizes outstanding voluntary contributions made by a contact centre to the citizens of N.B. Recipients are selected for "demonstrating tremendous spirit and enriching both their workplace and their community." The LSS team faithfully fundraises for the IWK and Kids Help Phone as part of the Contact Centre Challenge but last fall, the group decided that they could do more. Their generosity and willingness to "do more" translated into some unique support for the Moncton Headstart Christmas food box program, Nazareth House, and Sue Stultz's turkey drive. Moncton Headstart received nearly 400, one kilogram jars of peanut butter in time for their Christmas food box program. Any ALC employees who donated jars were "thanked" by LSS, who arranged a "letter from Santa" for the peanut butter donor's child of choice. Thanks to LSS, Christmas also came to the 30 residents of Nazareth House. Each received a gift and a box of essentials including a toothbrush, mittens, toques, razors and socks. They didn't stop there. In January, they were compelled to fundraise again; this time in support of tsunami relief, and generated \$1165 for the cause. Most recently, LSS handed over a cheque for \$3889 at the IWK telethon, representing their fundraising efforts for that charity.
