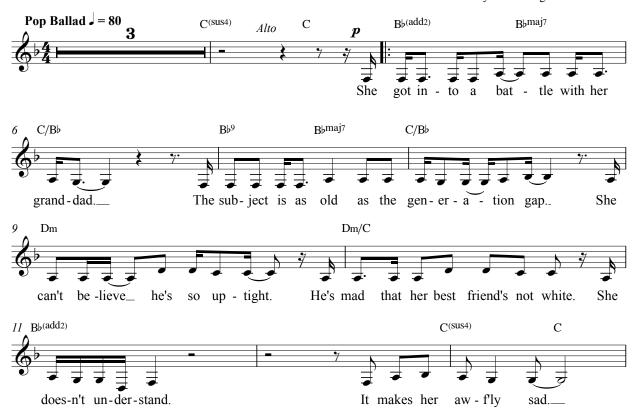
On the original recording the alto is European-American and the tenor is African-American.



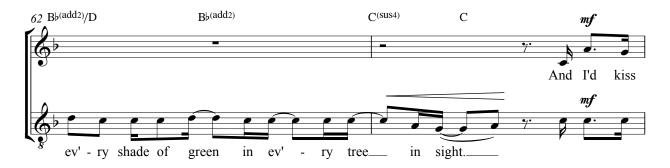
