## **Building a Peace Library Assembling a Peace Shelf**

Teaching peace is the heart and soul of Dr. Maria Montessori's philosophy of education. If we are to educate for peace, we need materials and activities to aid us on our journey. As with the curriculum areas, Peace Education is best internalized through the use of sensory materials. By giving children hands-on tangible products with which to learn, the idea of peace and a peaceful world for all is possible.

In beginning to teach about peace we first define peace, and learn about peacefulness within ourselves. We learn about feelings, ours and how to read, identify and listen to the feelings of others. We move on to learning about peace with our classmates, with our families, in our neighborhoods and in the world. Books about peace are introduced and explore topics of peace and people and our part in a peaceful world.

Young children first begin to understand peace when they can see themselves in the explanation. The Peace books listed here are simply beautiful books that allow the children to see themselves while offering thoughts and ideas they can understand and master. Included are some of my favorite awe-inspiring books for gently opening eyes, minds and hearts to people, places, emotions and things from around the world in a low key, young child story book manner.

First read aloud in a group setting, these books touch the heart of the child as he or she later ponders the pages individually, reading alone, with friends or one on one with a teacher. Learning about the world and the people, places and living things that populate it tills the fertile souls as they grow and flower in peacefulness. The following books are placed on our Peace Shelf a few at a time and rotated throughout the year, to be explored and understood as the child is ready. Ideas for activities can be culled from these books by the teachers, and often are suggested by the children as they talk about how the books make them think or feel about themselves, the world and others. The children get excited about the seed of an idea they pluck from a book, and how they can bring their idea to fruition through a classroom activity or game.
