In fact, the top two substances that parents of young children call the North Carolina poison control center about are **personal care products** and **cleaners**.

The room-by-room checklist on this card can help you think about the products you may have in your home and where they are stored. The best place to store these items is up and out of children's reach.

Remember, purses can also contain products that may be harmful to children.

Not to worry—if someone happens to misuse a product, the nurses and pharmacists of the North Carolina poison control center are available **immediately** around the clock. With their advice, an Emergency Room visit may not be needed.

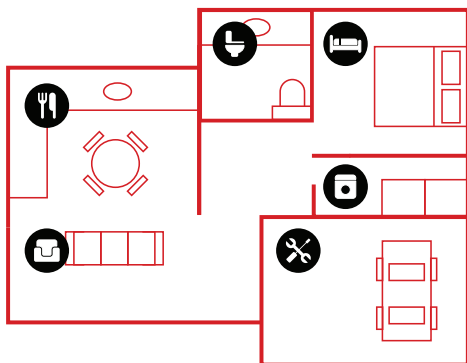
